Professional Entry Requirements:

Students not possessing an undergraduate degree may seek provisional admission into a Graduate Certificate in Arts (with a professional concentration) via Professional Entry.

This entry requires the student to:

- possess a minimum of 5 years relevant work experience in the senior leadership role, or
- possess a minimum of 8 years relevant work experience in a range of leadership roles from associate leader to senior team leader, or
- possess a minimum of 10 years relevant work experience in an associate leader role and be over the age of 30

Unfolding Grace to Lead: Personal Growth for Leadership (Trimester 2, 2020)

Spiritual and emotional health are intertwined...and hard to maintain, let alone grow. Christian leaders, whether in public ministry or not, face additional stressors that impact them in significant ways. Heighten your awareness and engage critically with others to develop healthy attitudes and practices. Integrate spirituality and leadership practices to strengthen your well-being and Christian leadership.

Well-Being and Social Justice (Trimester 3, 2020)

What has Christianity to do with human flourishing and justice in a secular society? Is it right that the church engages with the world of politics? What can Christians do in the face of hate speech and misrepresentation in the media? In a multicultural and multifaith society how can Christians foster the notion of “the common good” and put it into practice? Find God-honouring answers as you engage with a range of current social challenges.

Pastoral Counselling in Ministry (Trimester 1, 2021)

Developing the relational dimension of ministry is as crucial to its effectiveness as an understanding of theological orthodoxy. Learn basic listening and pastoral counselling skills while differentiating between spiritual direction and pastoral counselling. Examine and reflect critically on various models of pastoral counselling that are integral to the process of ministry.

Pastoral Counselling: Grief, Loss and Trauma (Trimester 2, 2021)

Pastoral care requires frequent and effective engagement with issues relating to grief and trauma. Rudimentary skills in this arena will not suffice. Explore how suffering impacts people; differentiate between grief, loss, and trauma; examine normal and pathological grief processes; and equip yourself with culturally appropriate forms of support, assistance and Pastoral Care.
