Nazarene Theological College exists to deepen faith, expand knowledge, and inspire Christlike action, so that God is glorified, the church is strengthened, and the world is transformed.

The International Church of the Nazarene

Nazarene Theological College is one of fifty higher education institutions affiliated with the Church of the Nazarene. These institutions are located all over the world, in urban centres, leafy suburbs, and far out in the bush. From a large liberal arts university in southern California, to a Bible college in Samoa; from a satellite campus of NTC in Auckland, to a theological college in the United Kingdom; the Church of the Nazarene provides higher education opportunities that span the globe.

Most of these institutions were established to educate women and men for mission and ministry. This is reflected in the denomination's mission statement on education:

"Education in the Church of the Nazarene, rooted in the biblical and theological commitments of the Wesleyan and holiness movements and accountable to the stated mission of the denomination, aims to guide those who look to it in accepting, in nurturing, and in expressing in service to the church and world consistent and coherent Christian understandings of social and individual life." *

NTC seeks to embody this mission statement, drawing wisdom from the Bible, the Wesleyan tradition, and the holiness movement, by emphasising the wholistic formation of students towards a life of Christlike service to others. While many of our students are members of the Church of the Nazarene, the NTC student body and staff include people from a variety of Christian denominations, particularly those in the Wesleyan tradition.

Brisbane, AUSTRALIA

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS vary for each award offered by the college. Undergraduate awards usually require the completion of Year 12. Postgraduate awards usually require the completion of a Bachelor award.

Students who have not completed their previous studies in English must demonstrate **English proficiency** (in IELTS or equivalent test) at an appropriate level for the award they are seeking to enrol in:

Undergraduate: 6.0 with no score less than 5.5 in all bands of the test. **Postgraduate:** 7.0 with no score less than 6.5 in all bands of the test.

Research: 7.0 in all bands of the test.

Diploma of Christian Studies | Bachelor of Theology | Bachelor of Ministry

- Satisfactory completion of year 12 in the Australian school system or equivalent, with English proficiency; or
- Be over the age of 21; or
- Have adequate grounds for special entry; and
- Meet the English Language requirements for entry to the course.

Graduate Certificate in Arts/Chaplaincy/Theological Studies | Graduate Diploma of Arts/Theological Studies | Master of Divinity

- A three-year Australian Qualification Framework (AQF) level 7 award in any discipline; or
- Professional Entry (Graduate Certificate in Arts or Chaplaincy); and
- Meet the English Language requirements for entry to the course.

Master of Arts

- An AQF level 7 or 8 award in the discipline of Theology or Ministry;
 and
- Meet the English Language requirements for entry to the course.

Master of Theological Studies

- An SCD Graduate Certificate in Theological Studies or the equivalent.
- Meet the English Language requirements for entry to the course.



HIGHER DEGREES BY RESEARCH IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE SYDNEY COLLEGE OF DIVINITY (SCD)

Master of Philosophy (MPhil) | Doctor of Ministry (DMin) | Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) | Doctor of Theology (ThD)

- All MPhil, PhD and ThD candidates proceed to the award by research and thesis alone. For DMin candidates 20% of the award is by coursework and 80% by research and thesis.

Ordination Course of Study: Church of the Nazarene

Four Courses at NTC may* meet educational requirements for Ordination in the Church of the Nazarene. These are:

- Bachelor of Theology
- Bachelor of Ministry
- Master of Divinity
- Christian Ministry Training Award**
- * Students must successfully complete the 24 units comprising these awards using the "Ordination Course of Study Progress Plan." Taking units outside of the prescribed Plan may not meet the educational requirements for ordination. "Personalized Ministry Units" must be selected in consultation with both NTC and your local District Ministries Board.
- ** The Christian Ministry Training Certificate is not accredited by any government agency but is recognised by the Church of the Nazarene. Any credits earned in this program are not transferable to any accredited college program. Approval for entrance into this program must be sought beforehand through your local District Ministry Board.

Student learning hours are the same for each program: 3600 hours (or approximately 150 hours per class unit)

Ordination Course of Study: Wesleyan Methodist Church

NTC is an approved partner college for Wesleyan Methodist ministerial candidates. Students may complete most of the educational requirements for licencing and ordination through our Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Ministry or Master of Divinity courses. For more information, speak to the Registrar prior to commencing study with NTC to help ensure you are taking the required units.

Ordination Course of Study: The Salvation Army

NTC is an approved college for Salvation Army candidates, through our Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Ministry or Master of Divinity courses. For more information, speak to the Registrar before commencing study.

Some fees for non-accredited courses attract GST. Courses will not be recorded on the academic record nor an award conferred until the student's account is paid in full. All fees are subject to periodic review. All dollar amounts are in Australian dollars.



NTC offers quality theological education with various study options to enable more students to do formal study alongside their current responsibilities. In all cases, the standard of teaching, learning, and assessment remains the same. A timetable detailing class units and days is available prior to each trimester.

Regular

Units which are delivered face-to-face (in person and by synchronous video conferencing) and require weekly attendance throughout a twelve-week trimester.

Intensive

Units which are delivered face-to-face (in person and by synchronous video conferencing) over a one-week or two-week period, normally during the early part of a trimester. The student has the same timeframe of a normal trimester-long program (twelve weeks) to complete assessment tasks. Faculty are available for consultation following the Intensive.

Extensive

Units which are delivered face-to-face (in person and by synchronous video conferencing) over a number of days spread across a trimester, e.g. five individual days (say, Tuesdays) or two to three weekends. The student has the same timeframe of a normal trimester-long program (twelve weeks) to complete assessment tasks. Faculty are available for consultation following the Extensive.

Directed Study Mode

When a unit is not offered in the trimester in which the candidate wishes to take it, the student, by arrangement with the lecturer, may study the course in directed study mode. It is essentially a reading course with some individual, face-to-face (in person or by video conferencing) contact with the lecturer arranged for mutually convenient times.

Research Project

The Research Project builds on the theological background, capacity, and interests of a student and enables her or him to pursue broad research, often of a survey nature, into an area or topic within a discipline or across disciplines. This research cannot usually be done within the strictures of individual coursework units or the focused study of a particular topic.

Research Essay

The Research Essay is usually worth 18 credit points and is 10,000–12,000 words in length. The student is assisted in the preparation of the essay by a supervisor appointed by the Member Institution in which the student is enrolled. Approval for the research long essay topic is obtained from the Research Committee, and where applicable may require clearance by the Ethics Committee. The Research Essay is examined by two examiners one of whom is normally from outside the Member Institution where the student is enrolled. The supervisor in not eligible to be an examiner.



Are you considering studying in Australia as an overseas student?

Most awards that are offered at NTC are approved by the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS). This means that these awards are available for people studying in Australia on a student visa.

Considering transferring to NTC from another institution?

At NTC you may be able to use course credits you have already earned from other institutions to build on your studies.

The Australian Government organisation National Office of Overseas Skills Recognition (NOOSR) helps Australian institutions to recognise qualifications from overseas, allowing for transfer of your previous studies. Credit transfer is available in both undergraduate and postgraduate programs, at the discretion of the institution.

Nazarene Theological College is not simply an institution focused on the pursuit of academic excellence in theological studies; we are committed to fostering an environment that cares for the whole individual. Spiritual formation is considered a critical part of that process.

While classroom study and chapel can assist in spiritual formation, we recognise that deliberate, regular meeting with one or two others offers opportunities for spiritual development. NTC provides opportunities that are designed to facilitate prayer, accountability and support. The Chaplain is also available to meet and pray with students. In addition, NTC encourages all students to engage in deliberate mentorships for the purpose of prayer and spiritual formation.

Prayer Room

All students at NTC have access to a designated prayer room and prayer garden, which offers a space to slow down, be quiet, and reflect.

Community Prayer and Worship

Community prayer and worship gatherings are held throughout the year (check with the office for dates) and are open to the wider community.





The John D. Fulton Library, located in south Queensland in the beautiful Redland region, is an integral part of Nazarene Theological College's life and vital for the students' academic success.

The library provides access high-quality materials that assist the educational and research endeavours of the students and faculty, including all resources needed for the curriculum. NTC's library houses nearly 30,000 print books between the Brisbane and New Zealand (Auckland) campuses.

For those studying remotely/online, the library provides access to an immense number of online resources through online databases like DTL2: over a million electronic books and academic peer-reviewed journals. This means all students have access to a rich repository of resources required for academic excellence, Christian life, and practical ministry.

In addition to these resources, the John D. Fulton Library also houses the Archives for the Church of the Nazarene, Australia. This special collection, along with the Rare Collection, and the Wesley Collection are held in the MacPherson Special Collections Room, accessed by appointment.

A limited number of residential housing units are available on campus for students. These one- and two-bedroom units provide single person, family, or shared accommodation options.*

Living on campus has many benefits for students. The College is a Land for Wildlife member, which means residents share the property with wallabies, kookaburras, goannas and the occasional koala. Our campus also has a nature walking trail, prayer garden, community fire pit area, and plenty of places for students to enjoy when not in class. Student residents have access to NTC's physical library, which is open twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. And new this year was the opening of a shopping centre just a tenminute walk from campus.
