New Testament writers characterize the Christian Church as ‘one,’ ‘holy,’ ‘catholic/universal’, and ‘apostolic.’ The visible, historical Church, however, has often failed to live up to these descriptions. Repeatedly the Church experienced conflict and controversy over important issues in theology. Was Jesus really human? When do we celebrate Easter? How do we understand holiness? Can we use images in worship? What books should or should not be included in the Bible? Theologians and church leaders wrestled with one another in hopes of reaching a consensus on these and other questions. Some conflicts were settled with grace and others by force. Today’s Church is not immune to controversial issues in theology. To better equip participants in theological debates today, this course unit will examine and analyse the development of selected Christian doctrines through history.

Trimester 3

Christ, Culture, and Identity, Theological Reflection and Praxis in... (PG: P9205; prerequisite 18cps Pastoral Theology or Theology)

“Who am I?” How do we answer this in a world under the pressures of competing claims about race, gender, politics, economics, and the digital world of social influencers? Belonging to groups (‘tribes’) of like-minded people can be life giving, helping us to deal with the pressures and confusion of life when faced with these competing claims. Tribes formed around such things as race, religion, gender, education, wealth, work, sport, or political affiliation give us a place to belong and allow us to maintain and deepen links with “our people.” But the tribal instinct is also an instinct to exclude – to differentiate between ‘us’ and ‘them.’ The resulting identity-centred conflicts lead to increasing fragmentation in society and are inevitably destructive of social cohesion.

This class is a Christian exploration of the identity question in the context of a range of contemporary critical theories that seek to shape our personal identity and manipulate us to identify with a certain tribe, while excluding others. It will encourage us to centre our identity in Christ and his people, rather than in any of the ‘identities and tribes’ promoted in our present cultural environment.

Historically, interpreters of Paul's letter have concentrated on the big themes of sin, salvation, and God's righteousness. We will take non-traditional approaches to Romans. Through a combination of exegesis, theological reflection, and historical analysis, we will investigate the political, social, and spiritual implications of Paul's letter. By the end of the course, students will be equipped to engage with the text critically, discern its relevance for contemporary issues, and develop a deeper understanding of Christian faith.

For many Christians, the doctrine of the Trinity has either been set aside in the “mysteries of faith not meant to be understood” basket or passed over quickly with reference to analogies of 3 leaf clovers and water that can be ice, liquid and steam. In the context of interfaith dialogue some Christians may even consider the doctrine to be something of an embarrassment. Studies in Chaplaincy: Complexities & Tensions (UG: C7192; PG: C8195)

The practice of chaplaincy comes with its fair share of complexities and tensions. Some chaplaincy work is difficult and requires a higher level of knowledge and skills to move through (complexities), while other chaplaincy work is theologically or ethically challenging and difficult to navigate (tensions). This unit will explore how chaplains can navigate difficult territories of practice through the development of a personal practice framework. Issues

explored include, diversity of gender and sexuality, interfaith engagement, child protection, family violence, critical incidents, disability, mental health etc. The unit material will delve into the personal, professional, and contextual dimensions of these issues, building up the student's personal practice framework along the way.
